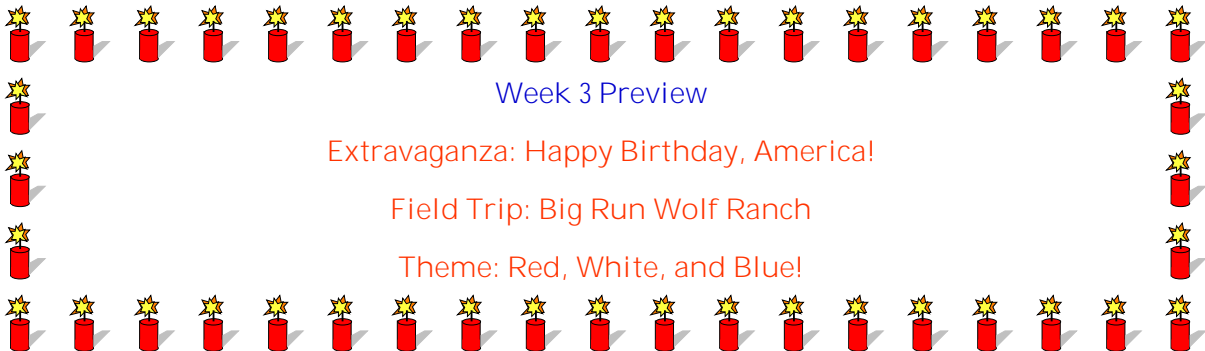

JUST A FEW REMINDERS...

Don't forget to send a FULL water bottle, a nutritious snack, a lunch (except for Wednesday), sun-screen, and bug spray EVERYDAY.

Afternoon pick up starts at 4:00 pm and ends at 4:15 pm.

Please be sure to check your child's backpack daily. Important hand-outs, as well as crafts your child has done while at camp, will be in their backpack.

Don't forget to label all of your child's belongings with their name
ESPECIALLY WATER BOTTLES!!

It's a good idea to send your child in clothes that can get dirty. Please remember we are OUTSIDE ALL DAY—getting dirty is part of the fun! Put a swimsuit and towel in **your child's backpack**—you never know when we're going to get wet!

You may also want to put something on the seats (and floor) of **your vehicle so it doesn't get wet or dirty.**

PARENTS, PLEASE DO NOT SEND YOUR KIDS TO CAMP WEARING SANDALS OR FLIP-FLOPS. FOR THEIR COMFORT AND SAFETY, THEY MUST WEAR SOME TYPE OF SHOE WITH A CLOSED TOE!
